Services at ATRIUM

The main focus of ATRIUM at gpe is the medical and vocational rehabilitation, distinguishing between work diagnostic and work integration measures.

Our work diagnostic measures focus on the individual's current personal situation and performance profile to identify support needs. Based on this, we develop customized services to facilitate social and professional participation.

The focus of the work integration measures is on the integration into the mainstream labor market in terms of training and employment. Key elements of the program include seminars on health and work-related topics, psychological and educational coaching, and the development of a viable perspective. The subsequent practical business phase lasts several months and aims at practical career (re)orientation, professional and theoretical qualification and, finally, the attainment of regular employment subject to social insurance.

Work-Diagnostic Measures

- InDoc Individualized diagnostic, orientation and coaching program for unemployed people with impairments of a primarily mental and psychosocial nature.
- → **DIA-AM** Diagnosis of the employability of particularly affected disabled people
- → FOKUS Identifying occupational interests, professional skills, and personal potential
- → SIL Social integrative services to improve personal life situations
- → Integration Specialized Services Transition from School to Work For students with various support needs who require additional assistance in vocational orientation and planning

Work-Integrating Measures

- → BIMA Professional integration with preparatory training, seminars, individual coaching and on-the-job practice
- ProJob Practice-oriented job coaching with preparatory training, shortened seminars, individual coaching, and on-the-job practice
- → InRAM Integration of rehabilitants into the labor marke analogous to the contents of BIMA
- UB Supported employment with individualized career guidance, job-specific qualification, and ongoing vocati nal support in companies operating in the general lab market

Ambulatory Skills Training

- → Staying Calm and Secure under Stress (by Kaluza), recognized and subsidized by health insurance providers as a primary preventive program
- → **Group Training in Social Skills** (by Hinsch & Pfingsten) as part of medically prescribed psychotherapeutic group therapy at the occupational therapy practice

Occupational Health Management

Organizations face the challenge of not only protecting but also promoting the health and well-being of their employees. A holistic management approach addresses the question of how to achieve health goals by shaping the conditions in which employees work. The promotion of healthy behavior among employees is inextricably linked to this. ATRIUM at gpe supports organizations in implementing elements of occupational health management (BGM), especially in the areas of workplace integration management and promoting resilience in the workplace.

The Mainz Model Project

Together with GPS (Gemeinnützige Gesellschaft für P aritätische Sozialarbeit mbH / Non-Profit Organization for Joint Social Work), we have been running the outpatient medical-vocational rehabilitation (mbR) Phase II under contract with the German Federal Pension Insurance (Deutsche Rentenversicherung Bund) since October 1, 2024. This is an important component of a three-stage rehabilitation model and is located between acute medical treatment (Phase I) and vocational rehabilitation (Phase III). During MBR Phase II, medical, therapeutic, educational, psychological, vocational, and social services are interconnected. The goal is to support individuals with complex needs in developing their abilities and returning to work.

Occupational Therapy at ATRIUM

ATRIUM at gpe includes an independent occupational therapy practice. Occupational therapy is based on medical and social science principles and is prescribed by a physician or psychotherapist. It is aimed at people of all ages who are restricted in their daily or working life, for example as a result of illness, extreme stress, a traumatic life event or an accident. The aim of occupational therapy is to achieve maximum independence in daily life or work, taking into account personal circumstances.

Creating Opportunities

The ServiceCenter is the right place for people who have experienced mental illness and unemployment and are not yet ready for the mainstream labor market.

As a recognized Workshop for People with Disabilities (WfbM), the ServiceCenter offers training and jobs in its own departments as well as in companies in the general labor market. Our wide range of work takes into account different life experiences and skill levels and offers a variety of training opportunities to prepare participants for the mainstream labor market. The first two years are centered around occupational rehabilitation: restoring basic work capabilities, job training, and planning for the future.

The workplaces of gpe are spread across twelve sites in Mainz and the Mainz-Bingen district. Tasks range from simple activities to jobs that are very similar to mainstream employment.

Starter Group

Starting a job at the workshop brings changes – not only in terms of a person's daily routine or the unfamiliar new demands of the workplace, but also regarding the self-image and self-acceptance of being a person with a chronic illness.

In the Starter Group, new workshop members have the opportunity to settle into the daily routine of gpe and become familiar with their new role as a sheltered workshop employee. The group leaders provide support and serve as a safe point of contact.

At the same time, participants explore, practice, and strengthen their individual competencies and professional skills. By visiting different departments and completing internships, they learn about the range of job opportunities at gpe, and, in consultation with a group leader, can try out a position that matches their interests and abilities.
